Look Look

Ages 6 and up. MindWare, \$20



You need a sharp eye to compete in this frenetic matching game. Players take turns picking a card from the deck, each of which sets up a lightning-fast challenge, such as spotting matching monsters, finding silly symbols, or solving fun (we promise) addition and subtraction problems. Whoever spots the match or solves the challenge first yells "Look Look" and keeps the card. Eight interchangeable boards make for a new game every time. 2 to 6 players



Drawing Game

Sketch It!

Ages 10 and up. Blue Orange, \$20



To succeed at this fast-paced game, you don't have to be the best artist in your family — just quick and somewhat accurate. At "Go," each player draws one of the objects written on her playing card. The first to finish her sketch grabs the highest number token, the second takes the next highest, and so on until everyone is done. If another player correctly guesses what you drew, you both earn the number of points on your token. 3 to 6 players



Superquick Game

The object of this game is simple: work together to win as many cards in a row as you can. The fun lies in the variety of activities you complete to win the cards. You may have to identify a smell, memorize a list of words, draw a family coat of arms, sculpt food, or act out a list of characters before time — always one minute — runs out. 2 or more players
